# Cupertino Block Leaders

## Connect Neighbors

The City of Cupertino Block Leader Program improves communication and increases public safety and understanding in the neighborhoods.

Block leaders help to acquaint neighbors and connect the neighborhoods with the City.

## Increase Public Safety

The single most important determinant of our safety is the extent to which we know our neighbors. Block leaders help neighbors look out for each other and get to know each other before emergencies.



## Improve Communication

The program encourages neighbors to see beyond differences and work together on common interests.

Leaders gain the **inside track** on new city programs and projects as vital links between City Hall and the neighborhoods.



## Time Commitment

The City challenges block leaders to gather neighbors twice a year for parties, meetings, and trainings.

On average, block leaders coordinate 25 homes each depending on the leaders' time and street layout. Co-leaders are welcome and encouraged!

Block leaders gather at city meetings for updates, training, recognition, and information sharing.

## Tips to Organize the Neighborhood

- **Knock on doors** to introduce yourself
- Plan a Block Party
- Set a Neighborhood Watch meeting
- Coordinate an emergency preparedness training
- Compile a neighborhood roster
- Work on a common concern, or neighborhood project

The City offers **training**, guidebooks, identification cards, photocopy services, and other resources to help you get started!
